Call to Order and Roll Call

With a quorum present, Mr. Perry called the meeting to order at 7:05pm.

Resolution

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Canning to approve Resolution 2023-04: Appointment of Antonino Intili Jr. as Board of Health Secretary. Second by Mr. Perry. All in favor – motion carries.

Health Officer Reports

Ms. Freire reviewed the Health Department reports for February and March of 2023. Ms. Freire highlighted some of the main points of the report. There were COVID outbreaks at Chelsea and Signature which the Health Department has closed out. Update was given on Abbott Rd. and Old Lane extension sewer project. A total of 98 homes are required to connect to public sewers and abandon their septic systems. Letters to these homes were sent out in batches. The first batch of 24 homes should have complied by now and connected to the public sewer. As of now 14 have connected and 10 have not with four who have paid their sewer fee. The remaining 10 that have not connected will be given 10 business days to respond and explain why the connection has not been made to the mandatory public sewer system. A health fair and blood screening will be held on April 15, 2023, at the senior house from 8:00AM-11:00AM.
